THE SHOW

Fruit Machine is an original physical theatre performance created and directed by Alex Rioux in partnership with Solo Chicken Productions. This groundbreaking production uses movement, projection, and historical text to interpret and investigate the horrific practices of the RCMP and Canadian Military that targeted the 2SLGBTQIA+ community from the 50's through to the 90's. Fruit Machine gets its title from the non-functional device of the same name developed by Frank Robert Wake that attempted to use pupil dilation as proof of a man's homosexuality. Created and directed by Alex Rioux, with a primarily queer ensemble and creative team, Fruit Machine shines a light on the barbaric practices and the unfair treatment of queer individuals in Canadian history and creates space for 2SLGBTQIA+ artists to take ownership of their history, and their stories.

After a series of work-in-progress showings, Fruit Machine premiered as the Main-stage Production at The NotaBle Acts Theatre Festival in 2019. Attended by members of the queer community and purge survivors, the show was celebrated for capturing the period with care and accuracy and the company was encouraged to continue development of the piece. Since then, Fruit Machine has been adapted into a high-quality touring show. In the summer of 2023, Fruit Machine received a New Brunswick tour, performing for audiences in Fredericton, Moncton, Saint John and Sackville.



She has been resident dramaturge at the Playwrights Atlantic Resource Centre's annual retreat, at Theatre New Brunswick's Fall Festival of New Plays, at NotaBle Acts Theatre Festival in Fredericton, and at the Fresh From the Island festival in Prince Edward Island.

Director & Creator

Alex Rioux is a non-binary theatre artist, improviser, and educator currently based in Fredericton, New Brunswick. Their work focuses on using physical theatre to enhance traditional narratives to create rich and unique theatre experiences. Other select works include: Mind the Light in the role of Allistair (Written by Gabrielle Papillon, Directed by Annie Valentina for Stages 2023) I Hope You Can See the Birds (Director, Notable Acts Theatre Festival 2022), Miss Bennet: Christmas At Pemberly (Assistant Director, Directed by Ryan G. Hinds with Theatre New Brunswick.) The Kelpie (Playwright, Directed by Esther Jun with Theatre'New Brunswick's Fall Festival of New Plays 2021). Alex also continues to spearhead The Plain Site Theatre Festival. Set Designer


